2016 was another groundbreaking year for the Animal Refuge Center. It's been a full year since we told you the story about the sweet kitty, Cookie, the little black cat who was paralyzed and mangled from the waist down from a horrible accident. We had not seen anything this sad in a very long time, and to be honest, Cookie's suffering touched us so deeply that she has forever changed the way our shelter looks at Community Cats. If you don't remember the article, or have not yet read about Cookie, go to our website, animalrefugecenter.org and read all about this little girl. But, use caution: her story will melt your heart. Needless to say, the first year of Cookie's Legacy has been

a roaring success. First of all, we kept our promise to Cookie: Each and every kitty from her family has been trapped, neutered and returned. They are a big happy family of felines with an assortment of sweet names, like Nestle, Hershey, Lorna Doone, Gingersnap and Sylvester. Some of the kittens from Cookie's Colony were so little that they were socialized and later adopted into their Forever Homes.

Our small troop of trappers, Madge Walker and Jamie Martin, has helped other Community Cats at local businesses and in one year we were able to help over 45 Community Cats. These cats were spayed and neutered, allowing them to lead fuller lives and, most importantly, helping us begin to make a

mark on the feline overpopulation problem in Hardin County. We would like to help even more Community Cats this year. Thanks to all of you who have donated to Cookie's Legacy, hopefully we will make an even bigger impact on free roaming cats. Your support is so very important to this program. Homeless cats. Homeless dogs. There really are not enough homes for them all. The streets and shelters are filled with them.

And the hard facts are these: Approximately 7.6 million companion animals enter animal shelters nationwide every year. Of those, approximately 3.9 million are dogs and 3.4 million are cats. Each year, approximately 2.7 million animals are euthanized (1.2 million dogs and 1.4 million cats). There are not enough homes for them all.

Our role as a No-Kill Shelter has always been challenging. We created the Animal Refuge Center Sponsor Program in the mid-90s, based on programs of charitable organizations, to allow people who wished to support our shelter to pledge \$10 per month toward care and maintenance of the pet or pets of their choice.

It was successfully implemented with full intent of helping overcome that Number One setback the naysayers said why No-Kill shelters would never work: The Unwanted.

Some pets come in off the streets and from homes that don't want them. There are reasons why many of these pets will never be adopted.

Some are just very old. Some are crippled. Some are blind, feral, have health problems, some cats contract diseases on the streets, but just need a chance at a life where they can know love. Unless they are absolutely near the end, they come to us, and based on their circumstances, find their place at ARC where so many have to learn to give and receive affection. We can't change the world all by ourselves. It takes one person at a time, each and every day, doing their part, and one by one we will get them home...or make sure their home at ARC lasts them for the rest of their lives.

It's no surprise she tested Heart-worm positive, considering she lived in standing water which attracts mosquitoes. We received quotes from the veterinarian and it will cost ARC \$500 to treat this girl.


